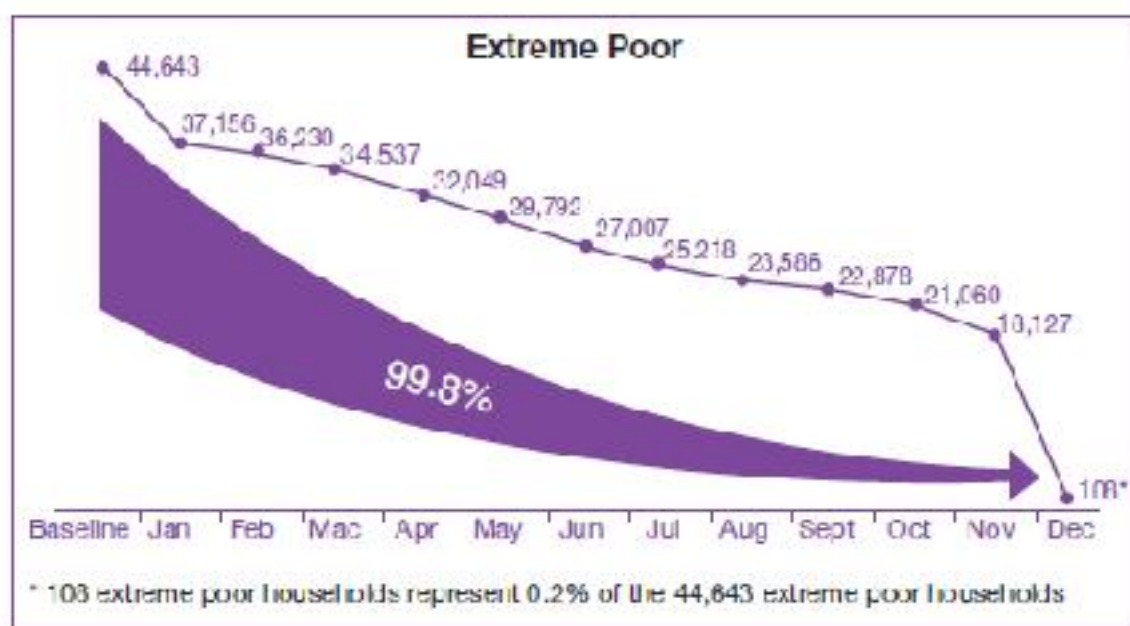
ACCORDING to the [Government Transformation Programme \[GTP\] Annual Report](#) released on 27 March 2011, there are only

Table 2: Definition of Extreme Poor, Poor and Low-Income Households based on Monthly Income

	Peninsular Malaysia	Sabah	Sarawak
Extreme Poor	RM440 and below	RM540 and below	RM520 and below
Poor	RM750 and below	RM960 and below	RM830 and below
Low-income Households	RM2,000 and below	RM2,000 and below	RM2,000 and below

Peninsular Malaysia (RM440 and below), Sabah (RM540 and below) and Sarawak (RM520 and below) with **NOT** taking into account of "RM441-Poor".
